Minutes

1. Presentation of Expended & Obligated Funds log – Samantha Montgomery
Expended & Obligated Funds log was presented, no questions.
2. Presentation of unpaid and approved applications – Samantha Montgomery
Unpaid & approved applications presented. Finance Officer Samantha Montgomery informed the committee that the only application that is outstanding at this time is for Broadband.
3. ARPA interest money discussion for Shelby Suburban Fire Truck and Coroner Oscar Camera System – Samantha Montgomery
The Finance Officer, Samantha Montgomery presented to the committee about using ARPA interest funds to reimburse the General Fund for the \$5,000.00 cost of a new ventilation fire truck for Shelby Suburban Fire. The committee agreed to not use ARPA interest funds to reimburse the General Fund. The Finance Officer, Samantha Montgomery also presented to the committee about using ARPA interest funds to purchase an Oscar Camera System and materials to equip newly donated ambulance for the coroner. The Finance Officer, Samantha Montgomery informed the committee that the City of Shelbyville and the City of Simpsonville would both be contributing \$7,000.00 each for a total of \$14,000.00 towards this purchase. The committee agreed to fund the remaining amount of \$11,221.71 from ARPA interest funds. A request to transfer \$12,000.00 in ARPA interest funds would go to court on 12/02/2025 for approval.
4. New Business -
The Treasurer, Sheila McGee presented to the committee that the EMS committee had discussed purchasing dash cameras for all of their ambulances and response vehicles. The EMS committee wanted to ask for ARPA interest funds to be used for this purchase. The committee agreed that at this time, there are other concerns that need to be addressed before the purchase of dash cameras and this is something that would need to be worked into the EMS budget to pay for.
